PE PREMIUM

The Department for Education announced this year that they will be investing £150 million into Primary PE and Sports. This has meant that our school will be in receipt of approximately £7000 for academic year 2013-14, and again in 2014-15. As of December 2013 this funding has been extended for a third year.

The PE policy – due to be updated after September 2014 to reflect new curriculum and in line with all other areas of the curriculum.

Impact of the Sports Premium on:

High Quality PE / Teaching and Learning:

High Quality Teaching and Learning is the fundamental building block to a successful PE and school sport programme. This year so far the money is enabling:

- **CPD:** The Royal School's staff to go on any relevant CPD training for PE including how to implement the new NC and inclusion in PE
- **CPD:** The Royal School's staff to receive an inservice day's training dedicated to gym and dance. These were areas of PE highlighted by staff in a questionnaire for further development
- **Making links**: The PE subject leader has visited a local middle school, making valuable links, observing various PE lessons in order to gain a greater insight in to the next steps in PE development

Impact: To work with the whole school development plan to develop understanding of children's social, mental and emotional needs and identify strategies to further support their learning through physical activity.

To support the effective delivery of the new NC for PE / cross curricular physical activity work.

ICT: Extending the ICT equipment and training

Impact: The ipad/camera is a valuable tool in curriculum PE. Its mobile capability allows it to be used flexibly both inside and outside of school and at sporting competitions. The ipad is a valuable tool in the lesson to model good

practice, to inspire the children's learning, support materials and programmes used in the planning and to be used in subsequent lessons to recap on prior learning and highlight excellent practice. It is very effective in guiding teacher assessment and supports assessment from nursery to year 4 along with squad performances at competitions.

The ipad was purchased in February 2014 and it will be used to create evidence for how PE plays a vital role in supporting all pupils at our school. Evidence is already showing pupils becoming more confident and focused in lessons. Finally the use of the ipad is instrumental in enabling reports, photos and results to be published on the website and in school.

• PE equipment: Purchasing a range of PE and sports equipment

<u>Impact</u> to broaden even further the PE curriculum to improve the quality of teaching and learning. To support the needs of all pupils by developing the range of age/key stage appropriate equipment.

• Time for the PE Subject Leader Liz Connors to devise new planning, assessment and tracking to prepare for the New National Curriculum 2014:

Impact: A whole school innovative approach to teaching PE supported by the new NC which will support every child's physical, social, mental, emotional and cognitive learning.

• Cross – curricular House competitions: A small amount will help buy resources such as medals etc to run a whole cross curricular school House competition linking to key sporting events: The World Cup and The Commonwealth Games. To be a long term focus.

Impact:To inspire pupils to achieve their personal best and encourage team work to score as many points as they can in cross curricular sporting challenges.

Extra Curricular Programmes:

The Royal School is a small first school where PE has over the last few years greatly impacted on pupils self esteem, improved health and well being, improved behaviour at lunchtimes, active and engaged pupils, independent leaders and learners, improved social skills and ability to work collaboratively

We have seen a correlation between sporting participation at all levels and general improvement /successes in pupils.

The funding is enabling our school to extend these opportunities further:

• Re establish the use of Year 4 Sports Leaders: money will be purchasing new sports leader caps, sports equipment and whistles etc for their activities they are planning.

Impact: Increase in confidence, improvement in behaviour and independence, pupils are happy with the new equipment / roles they are taking on. For example leaders will be involved in the weekly merit assemblies where they inform the school about activities on offer, they indentify and reward individual children for their participation, skills or behaviour by presenting them with certificates they have designed using the ICT equipment. Thus enriching their speaking and listening skills and creative use of ICT.

• A wider range of equipment purchased to offer even more sports and sports coaches

Impact: An increased programme of extra curricular activities to incorporate new and inclusive sports / fitness activities. Healthier pupils, new skills developed including reporting skills at competitions and after school sessions.

- To support curriculum work for pupils identified pupils where lunchtimes can be challenging
- Coaches for Gifted and talented pupils in PE as well as coaching for all

Impact: specialised coaching using coaches from clubs to support skill development and club links: AUTUMN TERM- Year 4 took part in a multiskills competition SPRING TERM- The Tag Rugby squad won silver going through to a play off competition where they then won bronze place, Robin's class in its entirety entered the Gymnastic competition with three individuals beings placed the badminton squad won 4th place in their competition, the football squad won silver place, SUMMER TERM-The netball squad won silver place in their competition he

Lunchtime/after school/lesson Programmes:

Sports Leaders

We have our dynamic team of Year 4 Sports Leaders aspiring to be coaches and officials leading sports sessions.

The leaders have undertaken a training programme and are now leading and devising fun games, skills and activities including: multi skills, football, ball games and fun activities for other year groups. Nursery / Reception children the Leaders have lead activities including parachute games, cheerleading and dance, and athletics skills. They have also helped audit the current sports equipment and its organisation.

Coaches

We continue to have coaches who provide sports for all and also have used some of the Sports Premium money to buy specialist coaches, some of whom are linked to clubs, to work with primary teachers. This is through our agreement with Windsor Sports College Partnership.

Change 4life Club

This new club supports and engages the least active children. Children have been identified and the club will run to enable pupils to develop and progress physically, socially, cognitively and emotionally. a greater understanding

Curriculum PE

We have also been using the Sports Premium money to enhance the ICT in PE to allow pupils to evaluate and assess their work effectively to improve the quality of their PE. Along with purchasing a greater range, and more age/key stage appropriate, of dance, athletics and games equipment. 2 large wall whiteboards have been purchased to enable pupils to gain further understanding of skills and objectives during their lessons. We now have a set of smaller individual boards to enable pupils to peer assess mirroring the good practice already found in other curriculum areas. Inservice training for staff has been arranged to support staff. PE Coordinator to attend appropriate training too.

Competitions

A big thank you to all the pupils that attend squad practise and are selected for competitions. We have had a fantastic year!
